SUGGESTIONS TO EXHIBITORS

READING: Please read the schedule/rules carefully to avoid misunderstandings.

STAGING: Make sure you allow plenty of time for staging.

LABELLING: The number supplied to you by the Entry Steward should be displayed face down under your exhibit to ensure confidentiality. This is your responsibility!

PRESENTATION: Presentation should be as attractive as possible. When entering jams etc., please try to use plain tops or wax discs/cellophane.



SHOW RULES

1. All ENTRIES to be made on the enclosed entry form and must be returned to :

Deadline: 6.00pm on Wednesday 8th August. No late entries accepted.

2. All exhibits to be STAGED either:

Friday 10th between 5.00pm and 6.00pm, or, on the morning of the show from 8.30am to 10.45am No late entries accepted.

3. CLASS ENTRY FEE for exhibits:

ADULTS: 20p per item for the first 15 items, 10p each item thereafter.

CHILDREN: Free. Children are also able to enter all adult classes at no cost but will be judged anonymously; only on merit.

4. No exhibits will be accepted for Handicrafts, Art or Photography which have previously been shown at the Crafhole Show.

5. Only ONE ENTRY PER CLASS PER PERSON.

6. R.H.S. rules will apply to all Fruit & Vegetable judging. Women's Institute rules apply to Cookery, Preserves and Drinks. NAFAS rules apply for Flower Arranging.

7. Exhibits NOT removed after the awards ceremony at 3.15pm and before the raffle and auction at 3.30pm will be sold off in the auction (excepting Handicraft, Paintings and Photography).

8. The committee take no responsibility for loss or damage to property.

9. Please could we discourage entries from exhibitors who do their work professionally. These items could be entered in the exhibition Class 97.

10. All trophies, vases and cups won in 2017 to be returned to David and Rosalie Dunn by Thursday 2nd August 2018.

PRESENTATION: Should be as attractive as possible. For example, root vegetables should be washed; carrots should have leaves removed, leaving no more than 3 inches of stem.
